- > Two available courses: Green Science and Green Engineering



- ➤ Deepen the understanding of your area of study, while learning and cooperating with other departments in an interdisciplinary environment









- Dec.9, 2022
 Nov.16~Dec.9, 2022
- 1. Only first-year applicants who hold valid status of residence in Japan



- > 1 st application (First-year only)
 Nov.16~Dec.9, 2022
- $\gg 2$ nd application (First-year and Transfer) Mar.15~Apr.5, 2023
